The sale starting with a bang with Texel 2/3 shear ewes from I & H Hornsby, The Stackyard selling to £275 and Beltex from GEH & SJ Stoddart, Hillside to £250 for a pen of 2 shears. A super 4 Shear Beltex from RL & AR Phillips, Fir Trees Farm reaching £230 leading the older ewes.

An increase entry of shearlings very ably judged by Robert West, Collyweston, Lincs who placed an outstanding pen of 5 Beltex X Texel as worthy Champions from Jack & Tom Peile, Greystoke Castle Farm competing for the D A Harrison Trophy and these being purchased by the judge for £330. 48 pens of shearlings over £300 to a top of £630 for a pair of Beltex X from regular consignor Robert Skelton, New Hall Farm. Big thankyou to our sponsors NWF Agriculture.

Averages significantly up on the year with shearlings rising £15 a head with a near 100% clearance.
