To cater to the North and West of Cumbria in September 2022 Kendal College launched a new satellite centre at Hopes Auction in Wigton.

20 new apprentices study 1 day per week from the Auction at Wigton in response to the huge uptake of Agricultural learners who have joined the college since 2021. It also recognizes the massive distances some students have to travel to reach college. The college are very keen to ensure that no student misses out on a Cumbrian agricultural education because of their distance from Kendal.

The current intake of students for September is 85, taking the total number of students studying Agriculture at Kendal College to 135. Slurry Infrastructure Grant


We now have further information on the long-anticipated slurry infrastructure grant. This grant is to replace, build additional or expand existing slurry stores to provide 6 months' storage.

The grant is based on standard costs providing a fixed contribution towards the cost of items and the storage you plan to build. There is funding available for slurry stores, slurry covers on the new or expanded stores, store accessories including reception pits, transfer pumps, mixers, transfer channels, and safety fencing.

DEFRA have highlighted their priority areas for the first round of the grant. These are the shaded areas on the map below. It is thought this is where the focus for the first round will lie, however it would be advised that if you are outside the area but are considering applying, that you still do so. This will mean that the RPA are aware where the need for support for slurry infrastructure lies for future rounds.

The first stage of application being an online eligibility checker is now open. This must be completed before the 31st January 2023. If successful, you will be invited to make a full application.

Future Direction of Travel for British Agriculture

BPS reduction

Government have confirmed that they will continue with the phasing out of BPS as planned with the transition to payment available through participation in the Environmental Land Management Schemes.

SFI

The Sustainable Farming Incentive (SFI) is to continue as planned. This is one branch of the Environment Land Management Scheme. There are three standards currently available: the improved grassland soils standard, the arable and horticultural soils standard, and the moorland standard. Applications for this scheme are open all year round.

Countryside Stewardship +

Countryside Stewardship + is to replace the Local Nature Recovery aspect of ELMS. We await further detail, though this scheme is expected to be an enhanced version of the Countryside Stewardship Scheme we have in place today.

We expect to hear further regarding the above schemes early in the new year.

In summary, it remains clear that this new direction of travel for British Agriculture is here to stay and is something that we are going to have to adapt to. BPS will continue to be reduced until it is no longer available, and the participation in the new ELM schemes is going to be fundamental in helping to bridge the gap of the loss of income.

Annual Christmas Show and Sale of 'Butchers Lambs and Prime Cattle'

CHRISTMAS PRIME LAMBS – 161

The Annual Christmas Show and Sale of Butchers Lambs took place in Hopes Auction at Wigton, which saw a tremendous show of top-quality Butchers Lambs. The pre-sale show was very ably judged by George Cropper, Accrington, who made the lengthy journey from Baxenden, Lancashire. George commented on what a tremendous run of stock was presented before him and said that the stock was a credit to all vendors.

Competing for the Henry Ridley Trophy, and very kindly sponsored by Tynedale Farm Services, Wigton, after a lengthy inspection of the over 90kg Trimmed Lambs and the over 90kg Untrimmed Lambs, the overall Champion Rosette was awarded to the Trimmed Pair from Messrs Hall & Son, Inglewood Edge, with the Reserve Champion being awarded to the Untrimmed Pair from Messrs RE Miller, West Farm, Aspatria.

Competing for the R Hall & Son, Inglewood Edge Perpetual Trophy for The Young Handlers Class, a ring full of festive buzz with children showing their prize lambs seeing smiles and joy throughout, with Thomas Harrison winning the under 11 years and later going on to win the Champion Young Handler 2022. Following the show, we saw the sale of all Lambs with the Champion pen weighing in at 48kg selling to £240 (500pkg) to the Judge, Mr George Cropper.

Top Price of the day was achieved by Messrs Miller, West Farm, with the Reserve Champions, weighing in at 48kg and selling to £320, selling to weekly Hopes Auction supporter RJ Harrison & Son, for their King Street Butchers Shop, Wigton.

CATTLE – 121

Yet again an outstanding show of cattle from the first to the last which provided our Judge Mr P Parkin, Howden with a stiff test of his knowledge and skill. Our exhibitors deserve full praise and credit for the entry put forward. It was after some deliberation that a 584kg Limousin Heifer from Ian Grainger, Kiln Close was tapped out as Champion and later realised 420kg (£2452) at sale time being purchased by Robert Pearson. Reserve honours were also awarded to Kiln Close, this time for a 723kg Limousin Heifer which was secured for the King Street Butchers Shop, Wigton by Paul Harrison at 420pkg. Cattle trade producing useful returns across the sale with the commercial classes performing well with

As ever the haltered classes produced a fantastic display of quality and trade on fire to a top of 590pkg or £3953 for a super Limousin Heifer from A Barnett, Brinns Farm who averaged a massive £3039.18 with his four haltered cattle. Top gross £4306 (550pkg) for a wonderful Blue Heifer, weighing 783kg from Ian Grainger, Kiln Close.

In all, eight cattle selling in excess of £3000 and thirteen selling to 400pkg or more.

Congratulations to all our rosette winners and many thanks to our vendors for producing a superb showcase of cattle.
