## **AUCTION REVIEW**

Another successful 12 months at Hopes Auction Company finds trade for all classes of livestock buoyant and well ahead of last years returns. Numbers of stock a critical gauge are also increasing with store cattle, and prime lambs achieving strong market leading prices with increased number of buyers and vendors.

This year opened with our annual opening sale of continental cattle and feeding bulls. From the outset, trade was very brisk as confidence in the stable beef price filtered through to the feeding cattle sections. This proved to be the trend throughout the year as all classes of stock met with favourable returns and on occasions remarkable results beyond vendors expectations.

Fattening sheep found comparable yearly rates through the first quarter, but extreme late season returns boosted spring lamb trade and indeed a buoyant prime sheep market has produced the goods all year allowing sheep producers to invest in quality breeding sheep from our sales commencing in July through to our Wigton Whites and at our rejuvenated Mule Gimmer lamb sales.

Throughout the year we have welcomed new clients on both sides of the auction environment. Having experienced Wigton for the first time they have followed that initial step and continue to use our facilities as a business base. All clients, old and new, provide an invaluable service and our hope is that continued success together will benefit all of us and help attract more neighbours and farming colleagues to our Syke Road facility.

#### Our top recommendations:

It is recommended all businesses look to take advantage of the SAM1 option. This involves having each parcel of land entered into the agreement tested for Organic Matter. If you have undertaken soil tests (with organic matter) within the last 5 years, these can be used in the agreement. Working closely with your agronomist, you will be able to produce a soil management plan and a Nutrient Management Plan (NUM1) which goes hand in hand with SAM1. Nutrient Management Plans are required as part of your farm assurance, so you may as well get paid to produce one! Integrated Pest Management Plans (IPM1) are also funded under the grant.

Another popular option is the establishment of Herbal Leys (SAM3) which pays a healthy £382 / ha. A similar option is NUM2: Legumes on Improved Grassland, which requires only one legume (e.g., red or white clover) to be established on improved grassland, this pays £102 per ha. Many landowners will already have clover in their grassland which you could be earning on!

If you are already utilising companion cropping or cover crops there are options to take advantage of too.

#### **FAQ:**

#### How long does my SFI agreement last?

• It is a three year agreement. The scheme can be added to annually.

### When & how do I apply?

- Applications are open throughout the year
- Applications are made via the RPA

#### When will I get paid?

 Payments are made in quarterly instalments with the first payment made 4 months after your agreement starts

Total payments will depend on the individual farm and the total area of eligible ground. For further guidance please contact our Land Agency department for more information.

## SFI Annual Health and Welfare Review of Livestock

Funding available for an Animal Health and Welfare review in conjunction with your vet. This review will fund testing for BVD in beef and dairy cattle and the effectiveness of worming treatments in sheep and include advise on the health and welfare of the stock including lameness.
